Trainer of the Year	This Award recognises the individual that has made a difference, shows dedication and an innovative approach to Royal Life Saving training.
Lifeguard of the Year	This Award recognises the individual that has made a difference, shows pure dedication or an innovative approach to Lifeguarding
Facility Manager of the Year	This Award recognises the individual or Aquatic Facility that has made a difference or innovative approach with respect to management of an Aquatic Facility.
Swim Teacher of the Year	This Award recognises the individual that has made a difference, shows pure dedication or an innovative approach to teaching.
Volunteer of the Year	This Award recognises, a Royal Life Saving Society Queensland Inc. member or affiliate club member who has shown dedication and gone above and beyond to volunteer.
Facility of the Year	This Award recognises the facility that has made a difference or innovative approach to swimming pool, or facility design in an Aquatic Facility.
Swim School of the Year	This Award recognises a Swim School that has made a difference, shows pure dedication or an innovative approach to teaching and water safety.
Award of Excellence	This Award recognises the individual that has made a difference, shows pure dedication or innovative approach to Aqua Industry

Terms and Conditions

- Nominees must be at least 18 years of age.
- Content must be original and created by a permanent Australian resident.
- All entries must be relevant to the last 12 months.
- All entrants must certify that the entry is their original work.
- Entry may be by the author or nominated by a third party (for example, a Facility Manager), providing the originator accepts the nomination in writing.
- An entry may be submitted by more than one person (for example, a Lifeguard and Swim Teacher).
- Where the entry is a collaborative effort, all major contributors should be included on the entry form and any supporting documentation. A team entry may comprise up to three individuals. If there are more than three major contributors, the entry will be attributed to the organisation or program.
- Royal Life Saving Society Queensland Inc reserves the right to verify the entry using the contact details provided on the entry form.
- Individuals / organisations entering a different nomination for more than one category must complete a separate nomination form for each category.
- If it meets the eligibility criteria, the same item can be entered in more than one category provided a separate entry and entry form is submitted for each category.
- All entries should be factually correct and must be the author's own work.
- Each entry should be uploaded separately.
- The judges have the right to reject an entry which, in their opinion, does not comply with the requirements of the recognition program, including but not limited to, category suitability and entry requirements.
- The judges have the right to place a nomination in another category if, as their discretion.
- The judges may determine award recipients at their discretion with or without reference to the criteria, and may also choose not to present at award.
- The judges' decision is final. No discussion or correspondence will be entered into.
- Royal Life Saving Society Queensland Inc reserves the right to withdraw an entry and/or award winner if it finds out at a later date that the entrant did not comply with the entry conditions.
- Awards will be presented at the Aquafutures International Conference 2019,ilf an Award recipient is not
 present the judges may present the award to another recipient.
